

Waltz, in-place

1. **box-step** { in 6 steps, as shown in the diagrams }
2. **inside turn** { 123 [regular box], 456 [she does inside turn past his right side] }
3. **cuddle** (variation of inside turn) { 123, cuddle ; backward, uncuddle for return to box }
4. **side-cross** { 123, r-side cross ; l-side cross, inside turn for "exit" back to box } [r & l is with respect to leader]
5. **open breaks** { 123, r-waists ; l-waists, inside }
6. **quarter-rotations** to the L and R {as shown in diagrams: f R R R R f L L L L }

7. **cuddle wheel** { 123, cuddle ; wheel [her-backward], uncuddle }
8. **cuddle-wheel** → **side-cross** { 123, cuddle ; wheel, uncuddle ; l-side cross, r-side cross ; l-side cross, inside }
9. **sweetheart in-line** { 123, sweetheart ; backward, 180° ; backward, unwrap }
10. **side-cross with he-reversed** { 123, r-side cross ; l-rev, r-rev ; l-rev, inside turn } { 123, r-rev ; l-rev, inside }
11. **zig-zag** { 123, adjust frame ; zig to r-side, zag to l-side ; zig to r-side, exit [*with inside or outside spin, or box] }
12. **he-turn sweetheart** { he-turn→sweetheart, she-turns ; he-turns, she-turns [change hands back to normal] }

side-cross options: cross, he-reversed, spins, dishrags, turns, waists

other possibilities: outside turns, outside → she-orbits, hammerlock wheel → cuddle wheel, sweetheart spiral turns, rock-steps, he-cuddle (regular, wheel, duck, in-line), ...

Waltz, moving

In contrast to the in-place waltz, "moving in line of dance" and "transitions" now become important.

1. **forward-movement**
2. **W** { /-forward, 2/8 R-rotation ; \-backward, 2/8 L-rotation }
W in **outside-positions**
3. **forward-rotations** { /-forward, 3/8 R-rotn ; 3/8 R-rotn, \-forward ; 3/8 L-rotn, 3/8 L-rotn } do as homework
4. **moving cuddle** → **walk-arounds**
{ \-backward, cuddle ; both forward, he-walks/spins ⇒ ; she walks/spins ⇒, he 1/2-walk to \-backward }
- - - - - (end of first lesson) - - - - -
5. **side-cross swing** { L-rotn, r-side swing ; face-together, inside turn } { options: with spins or separation }
6. **continuous quarter-rotations** { 2/8 L-rotn , 2/8 L-rotn ; 2/8 R-rotn , 2/8 R-rotn }
7. **zig-zag** { 123 [either /-forward or \-backward], adjust frame; r-side zig, l-side zag ; r-side zig, exit [to /-f or \-b] }
8. **sweetheart with alternating turns** { \-b, into sweetheart ; both forward, she-turns ; he-turns, she to /-f }
9. **forward-movement** with diagonals (moving-box is "halfway between Γ-box and straight-ahead")
with "mini-swings" { approximately [but not literally] 1/16 L-rotn, 1/16 R-rotn }

other possibilities: triple-rotations (/f,R;R,R;\b,L;L,L), conversation (with turns), rotations in outside-position, outside-turn (on 123), whip, grapevine?

FoxTrot

1. **box-step rhythm** (S-QQ,S-QQ); same 6 steps as in waltz box, but now done in 8 counts instead of 6 counts. **All patterns of in-place waltz** (QQQ,QQQ) can also be done with in-place foxtrot/rumba (S-QQ,S-QQ). Also, do **moving forward rotations** (as in moving waltz) but re-think the "starting point" for 6-measure cycle: in addition to { /-f, R ; R, \-f ; L, L }, think of another option as { L, L ; /-f, R ; R, \-f }
2. **two-step rhythm** (S-S-QQ); this is a different pattern, with 4 steps instead of 6 steps. **forward movement** with diagonals (box + forward → diagonal)
3. **hesitation**: in-line or with L-rotation at end
reverse hesitation: in-line or with R-rotation at end
4. **W** (same orientations as in waltz-W) (in waltz, rotate on 456 (RLR); in foxtrot, rotate on 234-steps (L-R-LR)
W in outside positions (frame and orientation is similar to that in waltz)
5. **conversation**: basic ; she does outside turn on S-S- ; both turn (she turns, he spins) on S-S-
6. **transitions**:
 - two-step forward (S-S-QQ) followed by half box-step (S-QQ) and forward rotations { R ; R, \-f ; L, L ; /-f }
 - two-step forward (S-S-QQ) followed by full box-step (S-QQ,S-QQ) and forward rotations { L, L ; /-f, R ; R, \-f }
 - two-step "hesitation with L-rotn" (S-S-QQ) followed by box-step forward rotations { L, L ; /-f, R ; R, \-f }
 - At end of box-step pattern (L-RL,R-LR), do **hesitation** (S-S-QQ) and continue in two-step rhythm.
 - Advanced option: "push forward" into S-S-QQ.
7. **4-count**: for slow-tempo songs (or fast tempo!), do two-step in 4 counts (QQQQ) instead of 6 counts (S-S-QQ).
8. **grapevine** { after QQ-rotation of W in outside position, continue QQ-rotations; exit into /-f, \-b, or conversation }

other possibilities: cuddle and sweetheart, conversation → walk-arounds, country-western tricks (moving swing,...);
zig-zag?, pivots

- ?. **box-step forward-diagonal**: combine box (Γ) with forward (l) to get diagonal-forward. { as in pictures }

Jitterbug (East Coast Swing)

1. rhythm is the same as in two-step foxtrot: S-S-QQ

5. For slow-tempo songs, do 4-COUNT (QQQQ, as in two-step foxtrot) or TRIPLE-TIME SWING (replace each Slow with a Triple-Step: instead of "Slow, Slow, rock step", do "1-and-2, 3-and-4, rock step").
Have students practice *triple-step swing rhythm* and *cha cha rhythm* before they begin learning cha-cha steps.

Cha Cha

1. **basic** forward-and-back 8-count pattern: 1 2 3-and-4, 5 6 7-and-8
2. **side-crosses**: similar to waltz, except for change of "starting point" and "exit direction" (when an exit is done, as is typical, at the end of a 2-measure pattern)
variations of side-cross: spins, turns, dishrags, he-reverses
3. **cuddle**: similar to the "one-hand cuddle" in jitterbug
4. **sweetheart**: in-line is similar to waltz/rumba and jitterbug ; alternating turns; side-to-side
5. **rotations** (left & right): similar to foxtrot hesitation-with-rotation
6. **alternating swing-turns** (she on 2, he on 6)

These patterns are similar to already-learned patterns, with minor adjustments. Make a sheet with timing of leads: cuddle on 234 (not 456 as in waltz), r-side cross on 1 (not 5), inside swing-turns (her on 2, him on 6), and so on.

7. starting the 8-count step pattern on the musical 2-count: either begin with "**1 2 3 4-and-1**", or just start on "2"
8. **chase** (a new pattern)

other possibilities: she-drift patterns, bath-towel sweetheart, ...

Tango

1. **basic**
2. **hesitation, reversed hesitation** (corte)
3. **outside turn** (her on 1)
4. **conversation, reversed conversation**
5. **conversation → fan**
6. **conversation with turn(s)**
7. **W**

other possibilities: natural curved turns, ...

symbols

F Forward half (first half) of box-step pattern.

/-f Both face diagonally, /, to LOD (↑). Leader walks forward, follower walks backward, both move ↗.

\-b Both face diagonally, \, to LOD. Leader walks backward, follower walks forward, both move \.

\-f Leader faces diagonally, \, to LOD. Leader walks backward, follower walks forward, both move \.

f Leader faces straight in LOD, walking forward. Follower walks backward. Both move in LOD, ↑.

ff Leader and follower both face toward LOD, both walk forward, and both move in LOD, ↑.

bb Leader and follower both have backs to LOD, both walk backward, and both move in LOD, ↑.

ss Leader and follower both face sideways to LOD temporarily, but overall movement is in LOD, ↑.

zz Leader (walking forward) and follower (walking backward) zig-zag ↗ and \; overall movement is in LOD, ↑.
